Successful Ofsted Inspections



2022 saw five of our schools being inspected by OFSTED. Wolgarston, Marshbrook, St Johns, Penkridge Middle and Princefield Schools were all judged to be 'good' schools last year.

In general terms, all schools were commended for having high standards of leadership, behaviour, teaching and personal development.

However, there is no sense of complacency in these schools or within PVAT. We note that despite strong aspects to each school's curriculum, there is also further work to be done in ensuring that every subject is planned and delivered in line with the very best. This is the key focus for all schools together with support from PVAT (Penk Valley Academy Trust)

We would like to formally thank and congratulate everyone working in or supporting these schools including teachers, support staff and local governors.

High Standards Of Health And Safety In PVAT Schools

Our schools are currently being audited for standards of health and safety. We are pleased that all schools that have been inspected recently have received high praise and the top grade for this aspect of their work. Given the many facets and complexity of health and safety, these positive findings are a testament to the relentless efforts and collaboration of school and PVAT staff. Indeed, the partnership work between schools and the PVAT central team was highlighted as a key strength. Again, thank you to everyone for delivering and maintaining these high standards.



Our Practice

Curriculum Development

Ensuing that our curriculum is rigorously planned is a key priority for us this year. To this end, teachers have been reviewing, refining and rewriting curriculum overviews and plans. We are focusing particularly on ensuring that, for all ages, we are extremely precise about the knowledge, concepts and skills that we want our pupils to learn. This level of precision often requires much thought, discussion and prioritisation, but ultimately it will deliver even higher standards of teaching and academic achievement.

'Curriculum Symposium' Meetings

To support the process, we are holding termly subject meetings across PVAT in order to share ideas, plans and expertise with colleagues.

Success In Exams and Tests

Towards the end of the last academic year we received the results from national tests and public exams. The general trend was positive outcomes or improvements since the last series of exams in 2019. Given the disruption of the Covid pandemic, this shows the resilience of our pupils and also it indicates that PVAT schools and families had provided a good level of support to our children.

As well as sending our congratulations to pupils, we would also like say a 'thank you' to all school staff for the hard work, expert teaching and the wider support provided to our children.

PVAT Partnership With Manor Teaching School Hub



Since September we have been working with Manor Teaching School Hub who are supporting our training provision to teachers. Specifically, they are supporting us with our training programme for new teachers who are in the first two years of their careers. They also provide a suite of NPQ (National Professional Qualifications) leadership courses relating to different aspects of schools, including early years, literacy, teaching, training, behaviour and senior school leadership. We have all been impressed with the communication and quality of support being provided by Manor Teaching School Hub and we look forward to developing our partnership further.

Improving Writing


TalkforWriting

'Talk for Writing' is an engaging writing framework which we use in our First Schools. The programme developed by Pie Corbett and supported by Julia Strong, has changed our approach to writing. With features such as encouraging discussion, stimulating interest and teaching planning techniques, this programme is driving up standards of writing in our schools.



School Review 'Focus Days'

This term four school reviews or 'Focus Days' have taken place. These are carried out by school and PVAT leaders working together. These 'Focus Days' look at areas that need evaluating and/or improving. Focus Day activities include lesson visits, discussions with staff and children, looking at children's work and checking planning documents. An agreed report communicates clear strengths and areas for further development.



Visible Learning

The research of Professor John Hattie ('Visible Learning') has been a long-standing influence on the work of our schools and teachers within PVAT.

One of Professor Hattie's key findings is the importance of teachers collaborating effectively, which he terms 'collective efficacy'. This can clearly be seen in our increased commitment and time for teachers to meet together to plan their curriculum, both within and between schools.

Ensuring Higher Standards

School and PVAT leaders are committed to raising standards in all of our schools. Local governors have received and scrutinise termly reports and presentations from each headteacher.

Trustees hold separate primary and secondary meetings every term where standards across all schools are evaluated. Key actions and support are discussed and, where necessary, additional PVAT support, expertise and resources are identified from within or external to PVAT.

Our Church Schools

We have two Church of England schools within PVAT. As such St Mary and St Chad and St John's First Schools have a strong Christian ethos, reflected in the aims and objectives for every child and adult within their educational community. All aspects of these schools' day to day work are informed by the Christian mission and ethos. For example, daily collective worship provides an important means of promoting Christian values as well as time for stillness and reflection, in what is often a busy, active day, for our children.

Close links are enjoyed with local churches, where progress is followed with interest by church members. The children regularly visit their local church throughout the school year. Church members also visit and support with a variety of the schools' activities and events.

PVAT also works in partnership with Lichfield Diocese. For example, we always have a Diocese representative as one of our Trust members. For several years, this role has been fulfilled by the Lichfield Diocese Director of Education, Claire Shaw, sadly Claire is leaving both this role and therefore her role within PVAT. We are extremely grateful to Claire for all her work, expertise and support and we wish her well in her new role.



PVAT Secures £2.3 Million Investment In Building Improvements

PVAT has successfully secured six individual building projects to improve our school premises through the Government's 'Condition Improvement Fund' (CIF). This represented approximately £2.3 million in total investment.

We have installed new heating systems at Wolgarston High School and The Rural Enterprise Academy. New roofs have been installed at St John's CE, St Mary and St Chad CE and Marshbrook First Schools, as well as with The Rural Enterprise Academy.

Detailed bids and plans have been submitted to secure further funding for 2023/24!

Improving ICT Across PVAT



New Computers In Every School

PVAT has negotiated a new contract with Dell to lease new desktop computers in every school. Further detailed planning is ongoing but we expect new equipment to start arriving in the summer term and to be completed by September 2023.

New Websites

New PVAT and schools' websites are being planned and due to be launched by September 2023. All websites will follow a standard structure, whilst giving schools the ability to compile and update details on each site.

'Penk Valley' Microsoft Tenancy

We are continuing to move all schools on to a single Microsoft tenancy. This will help to join up ICT infrastructure and networks to enable us to work more collaboratively and efficiently across all aspects of PVAT.

Support For School Premises

PVAT continues to lead and manage the maintenance and development of school premises. For example, PVAT leads and coordinates the work of school site managers and skilled employees who carry out day to day duties and repairs.

This helps headteachers and their leadership teams to focus on educational provision.

PVAT continues to develop this vital support to schools. As well as our own plumber, we now have our very own PVAT electrician, Rad Adameczek, who joined us in October.

Having such expertise on hand means that we can significantly reduce repair times and costs, thereby improving the quality of our site service to schools.

Other PVAT Building and Improvement Works

As well as working on school premises with funding from the successful CIF bids, PVAT has also been investing in other building and improvement works across the Trust.

Projects include: a new reception area at TREA; long-term maintenance work on the swimming pool; removing and insulation of roofs; new tarmac in some grounds; renovation of internal areas at Wolgarston High School; rabbit fencing; new classrooms and a forest walkway at Princefield.

As with all school buildings and premises, there is still plenty more to do!


Marshbrook Support Staff



World Book Day

On 2nd March 2023 Wolgarston celebrated World Book Day. Staff and students were able to come dressed to school in characters from non-fiction and fiction literature.

Throughout the day the English department and the school library ran activities focusing on reading. There was the annual World Book Day tutor quiz where tutor groups competed for house points that go towards the end of year House cup.

It was a brilliant day and students and staff had so much fun.

In the week of World Book Day Year 9 students alone read over 34,636,000 words. This is an amazing achievement!

Making a Difference

From the 18th February to the 3rd March a team of five Year 10 students, accompanied by staff and volunteers for the Link for Life Project, spent time visiting our partner community of Mafambisa in South Africa.

Whilst in Mafambisa staff and students spent time building relationships with orphaned and vulnerable children supported by volunteer care workers from the local community. Children assisted care workers with their daily tasks of preparing the meals and spending time playing with children, allowing them to experience the fun and happy times people often take for granted but are so important.

"It was a valuable once in a lifetime opportunity that leaves a lasting effect on those who you meet," said Isabelle Munnelly (Year 10 student), "I would recommend other students to take part if they are given the opportunity to take part."

"It is important to keep Mafambisa in our minds and hearts and to show that the link we have with them is for life," said Mr Leonard (Trip Organiser and Teacher of Science).

This term they have tried to ensure that their motto 'Aim high believe, fly high achieve' is evident. In the Spring term the children are all settled into their year groups and working hard on their learning targets. The focus in the Spring term has been delivering 'Talk for Writing', embedding the new phonics programme and then ensuring the curriculum is implemented in line with the intent.

The whole school theme for the Spring term was 'Earth Explorers' so we were keen to motivate and enthuse the children again after the Christmas break. Therefore, on the first day of term, the school was transformed into an airport. The staff dressed up as pilots and aircraft staff, classrooms were set up as departure lounges and the hall was check in and security. When children arrived at the 'airport' they had to collect a boarding pass and put their bags through security. The children then went to their departure lounge and flew off to various activities to learn about our amazing world.

To enhance the curriculum, particularly writing, each class has had an outdoor day at Weston Park, which was planned alongside Educating Kids Outdoors. The aim for this was to support and develop their writing. Activities included brainstorming vocabulary, re-enacting stories, making props and story retelling.





To support and develop their Christian distinctiveness St Mary and St Chad have had a theatre production of 'The Rhyming Bible' by the Saltmine Theatre Group and the children have taken part in a Prayer Space Day based on the value of Love and thankfulness. Also, they have received a plane to visit the school so the children can find out more about their partner charity MAF. Mission Aviation Fellowship fly small planes to isolated places to take supplies and urgent materials.
